Participation: You are expected to come to each class prepared to participate. Homework assignments are always due at the beginning of the following class meeting. You must place your name and class color on the top of ALL assignments. Srta. Boter reserves the right to collect any homework. If you are absent you are expected to turn in that day's completed homework on the day you return to class.

Quizzes and Tests that are missed due to absence must be made up. You must sign up to take the missed assessment on the day you return to school. You will receive a demerit if you do not complete a summative assessment by the due date. A 64% or below on a test will require a "Reassessment". You must sign up and retake the assessment during an OL within ONE cycle. All formatives must be submitted to reassess and failure to do so will result in a detention.

Independent Activities are due no later than the date posted in the LAP. These assignments will be completed independently in an Open Lab or the Library. You must sign up for conversations during the first week of a LAP or you will be structured. If you miss a conversation a Demerit will be issued.

Late Policy for Formative Assessments: (Homework, Independent Activities and Quizzes)

- All formative assessments are due by the date posted in the LAP. Any assignment turned in late must be received no later than the end of the next LAP and will automatically earn a 50%.
- At the end of the next LAP, all missing work will be given a zero and will no longer be accepted for credit.
- Each student will have one NLP (No Late Penalty) assignment per quarter. When the late assignment is turned in no late points will be deducted. If multiple assignments are missing and then turned in late, the NLP will be given to the assignment worth the most points.

Late Policy for Summative Assessments: (Conversations, LAP Tests, Midterm and Final)

- No student will earn credit or finish the course without the completion of ALL Summative Assessments.
- If a student misses a summative assessment, it is her responsibility to contact the teacher to reschedule.
